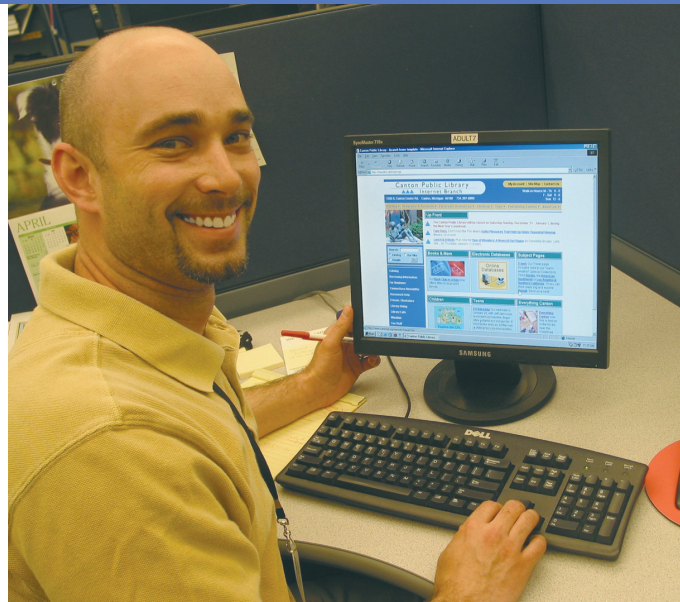

But it's more than just cosmetic — the new navigation system is intuitive and easy to use, plus new pages and features will make your virtual visit to the library more fruitful than ever.

Just like the bricks-and-mortar library, the I-Branch is also a place of discovery. Look to it for book, movie and music suggestions. Find special pages for kids, teens and local businesses. We're developing a set of more than a dozen subject pages, with librarian-recommended books, magazines, collections, databases and websites — all on topics of greatest interest to library users.

Check the I-Branch when you're at the Canton Public Library, or while you're... let's be honest, just about anywhere you can go online, any time of the day or night. The I-Branch brings the library — including its databases and catalog, along with services like MyAccount and Everything Canton — to you at home, at work, at school, even while you're relaxing at a local cafe offering wireless Internet access.

The debut of the Canton Public Library's Internet Branch came on October 18, 2000. Its emphasis — then and now — on fresh material every day makes it one of the most unique and resource packed library webpages in the country. The website makeover that you see as the I-Branch approaches its sixth anniversary has been two years in the making and was designed with you, the webpage user, in mind. 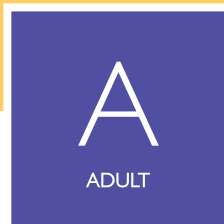
Summer Reading is in Full Bloom

Library Adds 6 Million Titles to Catalog



Have you searched the library catalog for material with no luck? Try your search on MeLCat, the statewide catalog that makes over 6 million titles available to Canton library cardholders.

MeLCat, short for Michigan Electronic Library Catalog, allows Canton library cardholders to search for, locate and request materials from a comprehensive electronic catalog of libraries around the state, including academic libraries and the Library of Michigan, making it great for special projects and research.

Just enter your search terms into the Canton Public Library catalog. If you want to see what's available beyond our catalog, click on the button that says "Search Other Libraries" and your search will be extended to all participating MeLCat libraries. When you locate materials you want, click on the "Get This For Me" link and your items will be delivered to the Canton Public Library for pickup, usually within a few business days.

Search MeLCat from home, office or the library, 24 hours a day. For any questions, ask at the Adult Reference Desk or call the library at 734-397-0999.

Locking CD and DVD Cases

We continually acquire new items in our audio/video collection and many now come in locking cases, indicated by a small, red square on the edge of the case. Checkout Desk staff will unlock them but if you use one of our four new self-check machines, you'll have to unlock them yourself. The self-check machines will

guide you; just watch the screen and follow the instructions. Insert the case gently into the unlocking device, front cover bar code up, and it will pop out, unlocked and ready for viewing or listening. Ask library staff if you need help.



Online Registration is Coming

This fall, Canton library cardholders will be able to register for library programs online. That means no more camping out for programs or jammed phone lines. To participate in online registration, you must have a Canton Public Library card, so beat the rush and get yours now. To register your child for storytime, your child must have his or her own library card.

To get your library card, fill out an application online at www.cantonpl.org or come into the library. You will need to present a current driver's license or state identification card, or one piece of photo identification and something that verifies your local address (such as a utility bill). Children under 16 will need a parent to present ID.

The library offers three reading levels, customized by age. The "Listeners," ages 2 to kindergarten, can join a group in which they read together with parents and other caregivers throughout the summer.

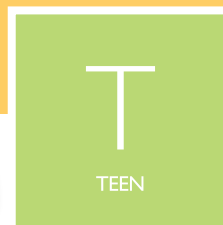
Kids going into 1st to 3rd grade participate in the program known as "Readers."

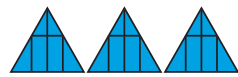
