Author Kevin Boyle to Visit


Kevin Boyle, author of the 2007 Everyone's Reading selection *Arc of Justice: A Saga of Race, Civil Rights, and Murder in the Jazz Age*, will speak and sign books at the Canton Public Library on April 18, during National Library Week.

Boyle's book was the 2004 National Book Award winner for nonfiction. It follows the trial of Ossian Sweet, a Detroit doctor accused of murder in 1925. Clarence Darrow, legendary labor lawyer, represented Sweet. *Arc of Justice* recounts the trial, explores the politics of racism and the growing pains of a young Civil Rights movement.

A professor at Ohio State, Kevin Boyle teaches 20th century American history with an emphasis on class, race and politics. He is a native Detroiter and received his B.A. from the University of Detroit and his Ph.D. from the University of Michigan. Registration for Kevin Boyle's visit begins April 11. Call the library at 734-397-0999 to reserve your seat.



That will bring our International Language magazine collection to about 80 titles.

Rent A Red Hot Title

Want to read the latest books while they are still popular? Consider a rental book. We set aside a few copies of the hottest titles for rentals at 20 cents a day. Instead of paying full price at the bookstore or waiting for borrowed books to be returned, you can check out new titles while they're still on the best-seller list. To see what's available, search the rental list at <http://catalog.cantonpl.org/>, then use the pull-down box to select *Shelf Location* and type in *Rental*. The display will show all rental books currently offered.

Keep in Touch @ Your Library

Use Web Express, our public computer stations, to check your personal or business email when you visit the library. It's a quick way to keep in touch with family, friends and associates and another one of the many ways your library helps bring people together.



- You can go directly to MyAccount before you start a catalog search. Then the system already knows who you are and you don't have to enter your name and barcode to place a hold.
- Once you activate My Reading History, you can use it to find out what you've read/listened to/seen before you take the time do a search.
- You can add to or change Preferred Searches. This is a time-saver if you often look for the same kinds of materials. Just click the "Save as preferred search" button and your search will be saved under your name. The system can send you an email message when the library acquires new materials that relate to that search.
- You can find out when your materials are due and renew them, determine whether you have any fines and take care of payment online if it's over \$5.00.
- Under Modify Personal Info you can put in that new email address or new phone number and you can choose how you want us to contact you.
- You can also find out when your card expires. We sometimes get frantic calls or email messages when patrons can't place a hold, get in to their favorite database or register for a class, and it's because their card expired, as they do every three years.

There are 41 titles available, including some very cool Tween books. We supply the battery, you bring the headphones. Plug in and start listening.








