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
Summer Reading...It's Not Just For Kids



Looking for news on Canton Township developments? Want a copy of the article about your son's soccer team? Now you can search the 2005 *Canton Observer* articles online.

From our databases page at www.cantonpl.org/articles.html, scroll down to "Newspaper Articles," then click on *Canton Observer*. Scroll down the *Canton Observer* archives page to the 2005 editions, then click on one of the 2005 dates. Click on the "Search" feature and enter search terms for whatever you're looking for. You'll see that earlier years are also available but the "Search" feature is new for 2005.

With this archive, you can also "copy" portions of an article. Look for the "Select Text" option in your pdf browser then choose "text" or "image," and copy it to be saved in a different document. If you need help, just call the library at 734-397-0999.



May 11, 12 noon






Literacy Learning @ Your Library


Finals Week Study Room
