

Book A Librarian

Save on Energy Costs With Killawatt - Now On Loan

The newest item for circulation at the library can help you save money on your energy bill. Check out an energy meter at the Canton Public Library. An energy meter can help you find out how much energy your appliances are consuming. Connect the appliances to the meter and it will display the energy consumption by the kilowatt-hour, same as your local utility. You can calculate your electrical expenses by the day, week, month, or even an entire year. You can also check the quality of your power by monitoring voltage, line frequency, and power factor. To check out an energy meter, please ask at the Checkout Desk.


Expert Advice for Students Planning for College

Canton resident Christopher Tremblay, Director of Admissions and Orientation at the University of Michigan-Dearborn, has this advice for college-bound students:

Applying to college can be overwhelming, but with organization and timelines, you can meet application deadlines. Consider how many schools you plan to apply to – each school will have an application fee, often ranging from \$25 to \$100. It is recommended that you to apply to 4 schools: 1 dream school, 2 realistic schools and 1 safety school. Most high school seniors apply to college from September to November. This might also be the time to create a professional email address for your application.

Listen Up to Audio Books

Tweens, you're not too old to listen to a story. Try an audiobook on Playaway or CD and have old favorites or new titles read to you. You can listen on the bus, while you're chilling at home, in the car or just about anywhere. It may help you better understand what you've read or give you a new appreciation for an author to hear the work performed. Give an audiobook a try.

New Registration Procedure Makes Planning Ahead Easier

In response to your requests, registration for Children's programs will begin two weeks before the session starts. For storytime programs, the first two days of registration will be limited to patrons with orange Canton library cards. On the third day, those with other library cards may register for available spots.

As with our other registered programs, the child participating in the program must have a valid library card. Non-residents and patrons with cards from other libraries can present a photo ID at the Checkout Desk to get their information entered in our system.
