



Park & Read passes are good for a one-day motor vehicle pass, to be used within seven days from check-out.



To use the pass, just present it at the park contact station. For a really relaxing day, you can also check out a hammock from 77 parks, for use exclusively by Park & Read participants. The Park & Read program begins May 22 and ends September 25, 2009. Certain restrictions apply so just ask if you have any questions.


