

Another Star Year

The Canton Public Library has again been given a three star rating in the Library Journal Index of Public Library Service. We are one of only two Michigan libraries to receive a rating. The index is compiled with 2007 data examining four factors impacting public service: per capita circulation, visits, program attendance and public Internet use. This is the second straight year the library has received a star rating from Library Journal.

This award comes as the Canton Public Library experiences the busiest year in its history. In 2009, the library checked out 2 million items, an increase of 13% from last year, issued approximately 9,000 library cards and averaged about 2,000 visitors daily.

New Service Lets You Learn a Language Online

The library is proud to introduce Mango Languages, the easiest way to learn to speak a new language. It's fast and fun with real-life situations to make learning more pertinent. Program Registration Changes

The Canton Public Library has moved to a standardized program registration process for every program offered at the library. Now all programs will fall into one of two classifications: registration or no registration. A program marked with [®] after the title means that you must register to attend. Registration is online for all programs, which means you must have a library card in our system to sign up. If you are registering a child for a program, use the child's library card. All programs will begin registration at 9 a.m., two weeks prior to the program start date.

A "no-registration" program is simply that – you don't need to register; just drop in and attend. All programs are listed in our online program calendar, catalog.cantonpl.org/iii/calendar/month. Click on the program title for more information, including a link to the registration form for programs that require registration.

New Self Checkout Machines

Due to changes in technology, in winter 2010 we are migrating to a new system. The benefit to this is that we are able to update our self checkout machines with enhanced features that allow you to check materials out, view the status of your holds and pay fees with a credit card. The new system also allows us to remove the locks from the locking CD and DVD cases, making for faster and easier check outs. In addition to replacing the four current self checkouts, we will be adding three others in various locations. If you would like instruction in using a self checkout machine, please ask any staff person.
