Early Literacy Areas Opens

To promote the development of early literacy skills, the library recently opened two new areas. The Baby Nook is geared to babies 18 months and younger with a caregiver, and the Early Literacy Area has activities for children up to age 5. Each area has activities designed to make learning to read easier for your child. The goals of these areas are to:

- Promote early literacy skills.
- · Inspire children to explore and learn through self-discovery.
- · Encourage social interactions and oral language development.
- · Provide practice with real life experiences that encourage reading.
- Add another area of fun to the library.

According to the American Library Association, early literacy is what your child knows about reading and writing before he or she can actually read or write. It includes literacy skills like print motivation and awareness, letter knowledge, phonological awareness, vocabulary and narrative skills.

To assist with your tax form needs, the library has dedicated two computers at our Web Express for tax form look up and printing. Also, all library computers have a link to tax forms. Copies of Publication 17 (the Federal Income Tax Guide for 2010-Instruction Book) are provided for in library use only and are available at the Reference Desk. We also have a binder of reproducible tax forms from which copies can be made. Printing is 10 cents per page.

The IRS is no longer mailing paper income tax pages to individuals or businesses. The library does not have copies of these federal forms, and very limited copies of the Michigan forms.
