Library Tax Reduction Approved

You might actually look forward to receiving your tax statement this year. The Canton Public Library Board of Trustees voted to reduce the millage rate Canton Township homeowners pay toward library taxes in 2009.

Library staff closely examined budgets to look for savings opportunities as across-the-board cuts were made for the 2009 fiscal year, resulting in a 10.6% reduction in the library's operating budget, compared to 2008.

"With economic belt-tightening occurring everywhere in our community, the Library Board has re-affirmed the need to be responsible stewards of your tax dollars. Even with our reduced budget, everyone at the library remains committed to excellence in service, programs and value for our patrons," says Library Director Eva Davis.



Canton resident Christopher Tremblay, Director of Admissions and Orientation at the University of Michigan-Dearborn, has this advice for college-bound students:

Admissions Selectivity commonly defines the academic quality of a college. Selectivity ranges from open admission (easy to get admitted) to highly selective (very difficult to get admitted). Selectivity exists to ensure applicants match the academic expectations of the faculty. By knowing a college's acceptance rate, you come to understand the level of selectivity. A higher percent of students accepted indicates lower selectivity while a low percent of admitted students informs you the school is highly selective. This helps you understand your likelihood of admission and where it's best for you to apply. Selectivity also exists because colleges receive applications from more qualified candidates than there are spaces available.

- Replacement cost for an entire kit is \$150.00. The replacement cost of individual parts of a kit will depend on the cost of each individual item.




